### Osmotherley Area Parish Council – 20th June

The new Chairman, Barrie Robinson, held his first meeting and was able to confirm to council that the search for the two replacement councillors for Osmotherley had been fruitful. Four applicants have expressed a wish to serve the village and interviews will be held shortly to identify the two who will fill the vacancies.

The meeting went onto hear that, finally, some success with the continual flow of water from the field at Westfields down Clack. It would appear a new ditch has been dug, which will help enormously to contain the water in the likely wet years to come. The footpath in front of the Village Hall, together with the road access paths, have been widened to help disabled and pushchair users gain easier access to the Village Hall.

A parking and traffic 'beat survey' has been carried by a company over the May bank holiday weekend. The Clerk confirmed that a report would be forthcoming before the next meeting.

The potholes on North End had been reported and inspected by Highways. The Clerk confirmed that the budget for the toilet refurbishment project is still some funds short of the quotations received. Further enquiries would be made and a potential claim to NYC would be made to help bridge the funding gap.

The Chairman expressed his grateful thanks to the previous chair and vice chair for their hard work.

# St Peter's Church, Osmotherley

### Restoration Work and Addition of Two Bells

St Peter's Church, Osmotherley, has received planning permission approval for the addition of two bells to sit alongside the existing three bells and for the fitting of electromagnetic chiming. Removal of the existing bells prior to the restoration work will commence on Wednesday 14th August and will take 2-3 days.

The re-installation of the bells will commence on Monday 4th November and will take 4-5 days. Between removal and re-installation of the bells no access will be permitted to the Church tower and therefore the Church Clock will be stopped and will be restarted once the bell work has been completed.

We have been asked if two local men would be able to help with both the removal and replacement of the bells. ### **Nature Notes**

Despite, or perhaps because of, the wet weather we have had over Winter and Spring, everything is very lush and green. The hedgerows have been full of blossom and now it is the turn of dog roses and elderflowers. (There is still time to make elderflower cordial.). It has been great to see that many villagers have left the verges outside their houses unmown and we've had a lovely display of cow parsley, wild carrot, buttercup and oxeye daisies as well as a wonderful variety of grasses - all of which will seed and feed the birds. I noticed a drift of Fox and Cubs (a tall member of the daisy family) which has bright orange flowers and is so called because of its fox-like colour and the fact that there are additional buds below the main flower). Alas, I went past 2 days later and they were all mown down. I wonder if we can persuade a few more people not to mow down the verges, especially where not actually outside their property. North Yorkshire Council deserves thanks for their grass-cutting regime this year. We were treated to a wonderful display of early Summer growth even though some has now been mown. This will all have helped to encourage the insects we so badly need to help. Talking of insects, the return of the swifts, even in reduced numbers, brings a wonderful sound of Summer - and reminds me of a line from Ted Hughes' poem 'Swifts' - "They've made it again which means the globe's still working ...."
